Reflecting on the past year, we want to express our gratitude and pride for the progress we've made together at SPIRIT Open Equestrian Program.

We've expanded our programs, welcomed Therapeutic Riding instructor Emma Walsh, and partnered with Wounded Warrior and Veteran organizations to help recovering veterans. Our Equine Assisted Psychotherapy program will relaunch in 2024.

We have made significant improvements of our facilities, including water installation and field renovation, which have expanded our capacity and improved horse welfare. It is hard to believe that before this year, we ran SPIRIT without running water! Thanks to the generous support of the Boy Scouts, we've added new gutters, extended and improved hay storage, power washed barns, and applied fresh stain. In 2024, we anticipate installing electricity and making accessibility improvements at our farm.

Our commitment to offering equine-assisted services to people of all abilities, mixing our mainstream and special need clients together, is unique to SPIRIT. Our success is rooted in the courage and determination of our participants, the passion and generosity of our volunteers and staff, and the philanthropy of our supporters.

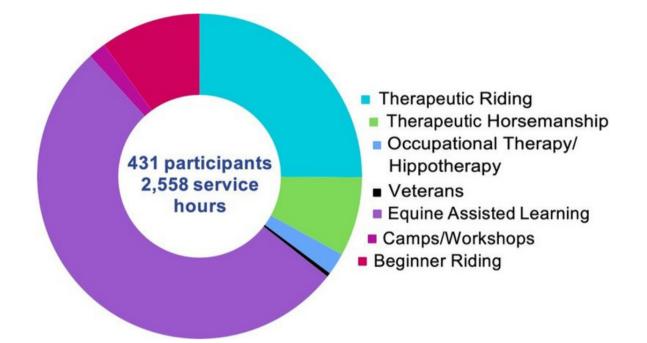
As we celebrate our achievements and anticipate future opportunities, we are grateful to you all. Together, we look forward to continuing to serve our community through the transformative power of equine interactions.

2023 Improvements



Water installation was completed in June 2023, just in time for summer! With a consistent water source, we can now provide clean, fresh water to our horses at all times.

Field improvements were completed in August 2023! The enhancements mitigate environmental concerns of run-off into the nearby stream. They also improve footing and drainage which support the safety and comfort for our herd.





Expansion of our hay barn was performed by Eagle Scout Miltos I. The improved design helps reinforce the structure and gives us more space at the same time!

Power washing and staining of our storage barns was performed by Eagle Scouts Will M. and Dimitrios I. Now clean from debris and with a UV protective coat to help, our barns are ready for many more years of rugged use!
